School Report Card

Coral Cliffs received a B on the state report card. Some interesting points of the report card are: chronic absenteeism, low socio-economic, and mobility. The UCAS score is 351 (state 346) with 211 points making up the growth score and 140 points making up the achievement score.

TLIM report

- *Big Rocks – The Big Rocks report was shared with the council showing the percentage of students in each class have mastered their grade level standards set by the teams.*
- *WIGS – Wildly Important Goals are set for each student. As they pass off their goals they are coming to the office to celebrate.*

Staffing

Rumors were addressed about staff numbers for next year. As it stands, the school will be able to keep all teachers. The council would like to continue to keep lower and upper grade interventionists if possible.

Homework

There was a parent complaint brought to a council member on homework assignments. The council decided that appropriate amount of homework are beneficial for students. The council feels students should be reading each day at home. When students are struggling with turning in homework, the teachers should ask why. Make sure they have the support they need and the work is appropriate for the student's ability level.
